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# Dispelling False Notions

# Core Definitions

## Divine Providence

# Clarification of Errors

Likewise, the world does not sustain itself, history does not unfold by blind force, and human life does not rest on impersonal mechanisms. It rests in the continual, fatherly governance of God.



# C — Formation (Judgment / Will)

Our intellectual understanding of Divine Providence must lead to a transformation of our moral judgment and practical orientation. This section explores how a correct apprehension of God's governance shapes our inner disposition and outward actions.

## Moral Judgment: Rejecting Chance

If God truly governs all things, then living as if life is ruled by chance is both irrational and spiritually disordered. Anxiety born of self-reliance reveals a failure to correctly interpret reality, diminishing trust in God's wise and fatherly care.

## Spiritual Implication: Meaning in Every Moment

# The Musician and the Sustained Note Analogy
